STUDY OPTIONS

There is no single pathway into working in forestry operations. Typically you will find people take a vocational education training route, alternatively at the tertiary level you could study:

- Diploma in Forest Operations
- Bachelor of Forest Science
- Bachelor of Environmental Science
- Bachelor of Applied Science



VET TRAINING PATHWAYS

Have you considered a vocational education training (VET) track? Get on the job experience while you undertake a Certificate II, III, IV or Diploma in Forest Operations. Talk to your careers advisor and they will help you map a path to working in the industry.

SAWMILLING & PROCESSING

EDUCATION

You can work in the sawmilling and processing sector straight out of school without formal qualifications. On the job training will be provided and you might choose to do a Certificate II or III in Sawmilling and Processing or Timber Manufactured Products. People interested in taking things to the next level might consider a Certificate III in Saw Technology or Certificate IV in Timber Processing

Get on the job experience while you undertake a Certificate II or III in Sawmilling and Processing or Timber Manufactured Products. Talk to your careers advisor and they will help you map a path to working in the industry.

HARVEST & HAULAGE

EDUCATION

You can start working in timber harvesting and haulage operations without formal qualifications. Consider starting out by applying for a traineeship or apprenticeship and then advance your career by undertaking a Certificate II, III or IV in Forest Operations.
